## Environment

Do not expose the phone to unfavourable environmental conditions (humidity, rain, liquid infilt ration, dust, sea air, etc.).
Outside the manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range $\left(-20^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\right.$ to $\left.+55^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\right)$, the legibility of the phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.
Do not attempt to open the battery or dry cells for they contain chemical substances.
Do not dispose of used batteries in household waste. Batteries must be disposed of in accordance with locally applicable environment al legislation.

## Traffic safety

Remember to always check whether local legislation allows operation of a mobile phone while driving a vehicle.

Do not leave your PIN code ${ }^{(1)}$ near your phone and store your card in a safe place when you are not using it.

## MAKING A CALL



If you make a mistake, you can erase a digit by pressing the (C) key. To enter characters " + " and " $P$ " (pause), make a long keypress on (0) (the following characters scroll: $0,+, \cdot$ and P ).

## - Making an emergency call

To make an emergency call, dial 112 or any other number given by your operator.
As with any wireless phones, this phone relies upon radio signals. Therefore connection for emergency calls in all conditions and at all times cannot be guaranteed.
