# Playing MP3

## Changing the display

### Each time you press and hold [•MEMO/ ━ DISP] during play




- The unit displays up to 27 characters for a track title, 30 for an album title, ID3 artist name and ID3 track title.
- is displayed in place of characters this unit cannot display.
- "AlbumTitle", "TrackTitle" and "ArtistName" appear on the top line when showing album titles, track titles and artist names.
- "TAG" appears when displaying ID3 tags. "- - " appears instead if ID3 tags haven't been entered.

## **Enjoying even more natural sound (Digital Re-master)**

You can regenerate signal frequency lost during compression, restoring to near pre-compression form.



### ■Limitations on MP3

- •Only artist name and track name ID3 tags (version 1.0 and 1.1) are displayed.
- •This unit is compatible with multi-session but if there are a lot of sessions it takes more time for play to start. Keep the number of sessions to a minimum to avoid this.
- This unit cannot play files recorded using packet write
- •If a CD-ROM format CD contains MP3 and files other than MP3, only the MP3 files will be
- Depending on how you create MP3 files, they may not play in the order you numbered them or may not play at all
