





The Region Numeric for this player is given on the rear panel of the player.








Connecting your System to the Power Supply

The main lead must be plugged into an appropriate socket.


- Before plugging your system into a main socket, you must check the voltage.
- Plug the main lead (marked AC CORD on the rear of the system) into an appropriate socket.
- 2 Press the STANDBY/ON button to switch your DVD Karaoke System



Inserting Remote Control Batteries

Insert or replace remote control batteries when you:

- ♦ Purchase the Mini Component System
- ♦ Find that the remote control is no longer operating correctly
- When replacing the batteries, use a new set of batteries and never mix alkaline and manganese batteries.
- 1 Place your thumb on the position marked PRESS on the battery compartment cover (rear of the remote control) and push the cover in the direction of the arrow.
- 2 Insert two AAA, LR03 or equivalent batteries, taking care to respect the polarities:
 - ♦ + on the battery against + in the battery compartment
 - ◆ on the battery against in the battery compartment
- **3** Replace the cover by sliding it back until it clicks into position.
- If you will not be using the remote control for a long time, remove the batteries to prevent corrosion.






Connection of the TV monitor



The following show examples of connections commonly used to connect the DVD player with a External Source.

- 1. Connect AUDIO OUT jack of the VCD and CDP to AUDIO IN jack of the TV.
- 2. Connect VIDEO OUT jack of the DVD KARAOKE to VIDEO IN jack of the TV or Connect AV OUT jack of the DVD KARAOKE to SCART IN jack of the TV.




Connection for better sound

Connecting to an amplifier with Dolby Pro Logic support.

What is Dolby Pro Logic?

Using five speakers, it recreates the original sound of the music or audio and provides the sense of presence, as if you were in a movie theater or concert hall.






Adjusting Display Brightness

(GB)

You can adjust the brightness of the display on the main unit so it won't interfere with your movie viewing.

Press **DIMMER** button.

<u>Result:</u> Each time the button is press, the brightness changes as follows: 'SLIGHTLY DARK, DARK BRIGHT'.



Loading and Changing Discs


The disc changer can contain up to three 12 cm or 8 cm discs without using an adapter.


- Never force the disc carrousel when opening and closing the compartment.
 - Never press down or place objects on the carrousel.
- Always treat your discs with care; refer, if necessary, to the section entitled "Precautions When Using Discs" on page 27.
- 1 Switch the system on by pressing STANDBY/ON button.
- Press the OPEN/CLOSE(▲) button on the front panel. Result: The compartment opens.
- 3 Place one or two discs in the front slots of the carrousel, with the label on the discs facing upwards.
 - Check that the disc has been correctly inserted in the holder before closing the compartment.
- 4 If you wish to load a third compact disc, press the DISC CHANGE button on the front panel (or DISC SKIP button on the remote control). Result: The carrousel rotates by 120°.
- 5 Close the compartment by pressing the **OPEN/CLOSE**(▲) button again
 - If you wish to start playing a disc directly, you can also proceed as follows.

DISC 1	SELECT(▶II) OR DISC 1
DISC 2	DISC 2
DISC 3	DISC 3

 $\underline{\textit{Result:}} \ \textit{The compartment closes automatically and the disc selected starts playing.}$

- 6 To change or unload the compact disc changer, repeat Steps 2 to 5.
 - Keep the compartment closed whenever you are not using it, to prevent dust from entering.
 - You can load or unload compact discs when the radio, tape or auxiliary source function is selected.






Listening to a Disc


This unit has been designed to playback the CDs: Audio CD, CD Text, DVD-OK, CD-R and CD-RW.

When you have loaded at least one disc into the player, you can start listening to it.

Continued use of irregular shape discs (heart-shape, octagonal, etc.) can damage the unit.

- 1 Switch the system on by pressing STANDBY/ON button.
- 2 Load one or more discs.
- 3 Press the SELECT (▶II) button on the front panel or PLAY/PAUSE(▶II) button on the remote control.
 - Note If you have loaded more than one disc, they will be played in turn.
- **4** To pause temporarily during playback, press the **SELCET** (▶**II**) button.
 - Note Press the SELECT (▶ ||) button again to continue disc playback.
- **5** Press the **RETURN**(■) button when you have finished.
 - When playing a disc, you can load new discs without stopping the current one. To do so, open the compartment by pressing DISC CHANGE button and load new discs in the other two vacant slots (not the one containing the disc that you are playing). You cannot rotate the carrousel during playback.
 - ♦ When no discs are loaded, the "NO DISC" indication is displayed.
 - The DVD player stops automatically after playing the three discs, if the DVD REPEAT function has not been selected.
 - If the player is left in the stop mode for more than 30 minutes, the power will automatically shut off. (Automatic Power-Off Function)






Selecting a Disc in the Disc changer

The DVD/CD function is automatically selected when Disc Skip button is pushed.

To select a specific disc, press the corresponding **DISC** (1, 2, 3) button on the front panel or **DISC SKIP** button on the remote control, until the required disc indicator flashes.

Result: All the discs will be played in turn, starting with the one selected.

If the disc selected is not loaded, the next disc is played automatically.





When playing a CD-R or CD-RW

User-edited CD-Rs (Recordable) and CD-RWs (Rewritable) can be played back only if they are already "finalized".


- You can play back your original CD-Rs or CD-RWs recorded in music CD format. (However, they may not be played back depending on their characteristics or recording conditions.)
- Some CD-Rs or CD-RWs may not be played back on this unit because of their disc characteristics, damage or stain on them, or if the player's lens is dirty.
- CD-RWs may require a longer readout time. (This is caused by the fact that the reflectance of CD-RWs is lower than for regular CDs.)







What is a Title?

♦ A title refers to a single whole movie.


What is a Chapter?

- A chapter is one of the several sections to which a movie is divided into.
- ♦ After 3 minutes in Pause mode, your player will automatically go into Stop mode.

MP3-CD Playback

When you play your own MP3 Disc, you can see below screen and you can choose song by numeric(0~9) or $\blacktriangleleft \blacktriangleright \blacktriangle \blacktriangledown$ buttons.





Intro Play

You can play the first 10 seconds of each track.




1 Press the **DISPLAY** button



2 Use **♦** buttons to move to the Intro Play display.



- 3 Press the ENTER button.
 - Each time the button is pressed, the display will alternate between ON and OFF.
 - ♦ Select ON to play the first 10 seconds of each track.



Search Forward or Backward


During playback, you can quickly move to the desired scene or song.



Press the **SCAN**(◀), **SCAN**(►) buttons.



- Note ◆ During fast play or step motion, sound will not be normal.
 - ♦ When playing a CD, you can only use 2x and 8x speeds.











Directly Moving to a Title / Chapter / Time

- 1 Press the GO TO button.
- The corresponding display will be selected.





- 2 Use the NUMERIC buttons (0-9) to select the desired scene and then press the ENTER button.
 - Playback of the selected scene starts.
 Depending on the disc, moving to a title may not work.



Skipping Chapters or Tracks

- Each time either button is pressed, playback starts from the beginning of the previous or next chapter (or track).
- But, you cannot skip chapters consecutively.






Playing Frame by Frame

Press STEP button.

- The picture moves forward one frame each time the button is pressed during playback.
- Note ♦ No sound is heard during step motion playback.














Repeat Play operation is not possible with version 2.0 VCD discs if PBC is turned on. To use this feature, press the Menu button to select "PBC OFF".



A-B Repeat Play



1 Press the **DISPLAY** button.



2 Use **◄** ▶ buttons to move to the A-B Repeat Play display.



3 Press the ENTER button at the beginning of the segment (point A) you want to play repeatedly.



You can play scenes/songs in random order.










Using the Menu on the Disc

You can use the menu for the audio language, subtitle language, profile, etc. DVD menu contents differ from disc to disc.



- 1 During playback, press the **MENU/PBC** button.
 - The menu screen appears . When playing a VCD (version 2.0), this toggles between PBC ON and OFF.
- **2** Use **◄►▲▼** buttons to select the desired item.
- **3** Press the **ENTER** button.
 - ♦ The selected item will be played.




To Use the Title Menu

For DVDs containing multiple titles, you can view the title of each movie.



During playback, press the **TITLE** button.






Audio Language



- 1 Press the AUDIO button.
- **2** Use ▲▼ buttons to select the desired audio language.
 - Depending on the numeric of languages on a DVD disc, a different audio language (KOREAN, ENGLISH, JAPANESE, etc.) can be selected.





- Depending on the disc, you can also select DTS or DOLBY PRO LOGIC
 - ♦ To listen to DTS audio tracks, connect an amplifier with a built-in DTS decoder to the Optical Out.





Subtitle Language





- 1 Press the **SUBTITLE** button.
- **2** Use ▲▼ buttons to select the desired subtitle.
 - Depending on the numeric of subtitles on a DVD disc, a different subtitle (KOREAN, ENGLISH, JAPANESE, etc.) can be selected. Select OFF to make the subtitles disappear.





- ♦ ⊘appears on the TV screen! If this symbol appears on the TV screen while buttons are being operated, that operation is not possible with the disc currently being played.
 - Depending on the disc, the Subtitle and Audio Language functions may not work.

Screen Zoom




- 1 Press the **ZOOM** button.
- 2 Press the PAUSE(►II) button.
- **3** Press the ◀▶▲▼ buttons to select the desired image.



To cancel the ZOOM



Angle




- 1 Press the ANGLE button
 - The multiple angle function only works with discs on which multiple angles are recorded











Language Setup

You can set up the screen display, audio language, subtitle language, and menu language by using the Mini Component System player's Setup feature.

1 In Stop mode, press the SETUP button.



2 Use ▲▼ buttons to move to a submenu.




3 Press **◄** ▶ buttons to select the desired language.



To End the Language Setup

Press the **SETUP** button again.



Audio Setup

You can set the condition for the output to the Optical Digital Out Jack.



1 In Stop mode, press the SETUP button.



2 Press **◆** ▶ buttons to select "AUDIO".



3 Use ▲▼ buttons to move to a submenu.



4 Press ◀ ▶ buttons to select the desired item.



 Transmits digital signal carrying Dolby Digital 5.1 or DTS multi-channel information to the external decoder

PCM

Select this if you do not have Dolby Digital 5.1 Channel connection

 Transmits Linear PCM (Pulse Code Modulation) or 2-Channel Stereo Signal to the A/V receiver



Options Setup



You can set the TV aspect ratio and video format.

1 In Stop mode, press the **SETUP** button.



Press **♦** button to select "OPTION".




3 Use ▲▼ buttons to move to a submenu.



4 Press **♦** buttons to select the desired item.







Select this to view 16:9 ratio movies on a 4:3 ratio TV.



4:3LB Select this to play wide DVDs in the letter box mod with black strips at the top and bottom.

4:3PS Select this to play wide DVDs in the pan and scan mode with the sides of the picture cut off.

WIDE Select this to play wide DVDs in the full-screen mode with the top and bottom of the screen cut off.

However, you cannot view in the full-screen mode if the movie on a disc is in 4:3 ratio.

VIDEO MODE

- Each country has a different video format standard .
- For normal playback, the video format of the disc must be the same as the video format of your TV.

For example, you will not be able to play a PAL encoded disc on an NTSC TV.

Rating Level/Password Setup

Use this to restrict playback of adult or violent DVDs you do not want children to view.

1 In Stop mode, press the **SETUP** button.




2 Use **◄** ▶ buttons to select "PARENTAL".



3 Use ▲▼ buttons to move to a submenu.



4 Use the **NUMERIC** buttons (0-9) to enter the password.






Password Setup

 Press ▼ button to move to "NEW PASSWORD" and then use the Numeric buttons (0-9) to enter a new password.




2. Press ▶ button to move to "CONFIRM PASSWORD" and then use re-enter your new password.





- 6 Press ▼ button to select the desired rating level.
 - Rating Level can be set between 0 and 8 levels.
 - ♦ If you have selected Level 6, you cannot view DVDs with Level 7 or higher.





If you have forgotten your password

While the player is in NO DISC mode, hold the main unit's STOP(\blacksquare) button for longer than 5 seconds.

 "INITIAL" appears on the display and all settings will return to the default values.



Playing DVD-OK Discs

You can enjoy the feeling of a karaoke bar in the comfort of your home. Watch the video and sing along the lyrics displayed on the TV screen against the accompaniment.

1 Use the **NUMERIC** buttons (0-9) to enter the numeric of the song you want to play.



- Press the PLAY/PAUSE(►III) button or the ENTER button.
 - The numeric and title of the song will be displayed and the accompaniment starts.




- To Clear Incorrectly Entered Song Numeric
 - ♦ Press the CANCEL button.
- To Stop During Accompaniment
 - Press the **STOP** button.



Connecting Microphone

- Connect the microphone to the MIC jack on the front panel.You can connect up to two microphones.
- 2 Turn the MIC VOL to adjust the voicd volume of the micro phone.
- 3 Turn the **DIGITAL ECHO** to adjust the echo level of the microphone.
- ♦ If you hear strange noises (squealing or howling) while using the Karaoke feature, move the microphone away from the speakers. Turning down the microphone volume or the speaker volume is also effective.



Reserving Accompaniment Music


While the accompaniment is playing, you can reserve the next song you want to sing.

- 1 Press the **NUMERIC** buttons (0-9) to enter the numeric of the song you want to reserve.
- Press the RESERVE button.
 The next song is reserved.



To Cancel the Reservation

- 1 Enter the numeric of the song you have reserved.
- 2 Press the CANCEL button.






Priority Playing Accompaniment Music

Even if there is a song already reserved, you can have the song you want to sing to be played first.

1 Press the **NUMERIC** buttons (0-9) to enter the numeric of the song you want to reserve.

2 Press the PLAY/PAUSE(►II) button.






Search Song Function


You can easily do song search on screen without viewing the song list book.

- 1 Press the SEARCH SONG button.
- 2 Press ▲▼ buttons to select the desired item and then press the ENTER button.
- 3 Press ▲▼ buttons to select the desired song and then press the ENTER button.
 - The number and title of the song will be displayed and the accompaniment starts.
- Note ◆ Press **SEARCH SONG** button to return to the previous level.




DVD-OK Repeat Play

REPEAT function will not operate if RESERVE function is set while DVD-OK is played.




Key Control

 Each time # button is pressed, the key is increased, and each time b button is pressed, the key is decreased.








Tempo Control

 Each time + button is pressed, the tempo gets faster, and each time - button is pressed the tempo gets slower.






Male-Female Key Control

Press the **MALE/FEMALE** button

- Select Male when singing in male voice and select Female when singing in female voice






Highlight Lyrics

A black bar appears by the lyrics area.






View Score

Press the **SCORE** button.

- Each time the button is pressed, the selection alternates between Score ON and Score OFF.
- Select Score ON to display the score of your singing.






Fanfare Function

Press the **FANFARE** button.

- Select Fanfare ON to hear the fanfare after the singing is over.






Melody Function

Press the **MELODY** button.




Do not expose the unit to direct sun radiation or other heat sources. This could lead to overheating and malfunction of the unit.



Do not place potted plants or vases on top of the unit. Moisture entering the unit could lead to dangerous electric shock and can cause equipment damage. In such events immediately disconnect the main plug from the socket.



During thunderstorms, disconnect the main plug from the socket. Main voltage peaks due to lightning could damage the unit.



Remove the batteries from the remote control, if not used for any extended period.


Leaking batteries can cause serious damage to the remote control.



When using headphones, take care not to listen at excessive volumes. Extended use of headphones at high volumes will lead to hearing damage.



Do not place heavy items on the main lead. Main cable damage can lead to damage of the equipment (fire hazard) and can cause electric shock.




Do not remove any equipment panels. The inside of the unit contains live components, which cause electric shock.


Disc Handling and Maintenance

Handling precautions

Hold the disc by the edges so the surface will not be soiled withfingerprints. Fingerprints, dirt and scratches can cause skipping and distortion.




- Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing utensils.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzine, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.
- Be careful not to drop or bend the disc.
- Do not install more than 1 disc on the disc tray.



- Do not try to close the disc tray when the disc is not installed properly
- Be sure to store the disc in its exclusive case when not in use.

Precautions When Using Discs

- Handle your discs with care. Always hold them by the edges to avoid leaving fingerprints on the shiny surface.
- When you have finished playing a disc, always put it back in its case.
- Do not fix paper or adhesive tape to the discs and do not write on the label.
- ♦ Clean them with a special-purpose cloth.
- Store your discs in a clean place, out of direct sunlight, where they will not be exposed to high temperatures.



Trouble Shooting Guide

Before requesting service for this unit, check the chart below for a possible cause of the problem you are experiencing. Some simple checks or a minor adjustment on your part may eliminate the problem and restore proper operation.
